Dense Fog Engulfs Kashmir Amid Freezing Cold

SRINAGAR: Dense fog continued to engulf most parts of the Kashmir Valley on Tuesday while the mercury also settled below freezing point at all the stations across the Valley.

With no forecast of any weather activity till December 31st, Director Meteorological department, Dr Mukhtar Ahmad said that the foggy mornings would continue to be witnessed during the next few days till December 31st.

The commuters once again had to face tremendous hardships while driving on the roads amidst the dense fog.

However, the traffic control room here has issued an advisory for the commuters in wake of the dense fog. "There is a need to be extremely careful while navigating the roads in the middle of a dense fog," the advisory reads.

In the advisory, the commuters have been asked to stick to their lane, Park the car and wait, say no to speeding, keep the headlights on a low beam, use indicators to alert others, keep the windshields and windows clean, adjust the driver's

seat position, focus on the road, keep the brakes & tyres in perfect condition and avoid overtaking.

Besides, the night temperature continues to settle below freezing point across the Valley today while Pahalgam was the coldest place at minus 4.7 degree Celsius.

According to the data prepared by the MeT department here, Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu & Kashmir shivered at minus 3.0 degree Celsius while a similar night temperature of minus 3.0 degree Cel-



'Zero tolerance against drug abuse'

DC Srinagar chairs NCORD meeting

SRINAGAR: Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz meeting of District Level meeting on Prevention of Drug Abuse & Narcotics Trade(NCORD) here at Meeting Hall of DC Office Complex to review the measures taken by Law **Enforcement Agencies and** other Stakeholders to curb the menace of drug abuse and crush the Hotspots of drug peddling in Srinagar District

Besides, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Syed Shabir Ahmad, Superintendent of Police, Arif Amin Shah, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Syed Ahmad Kataria and SP Traffic, Tariq Ahmad, the meeting was attended by Programme Officer ICDS, Chief Medical Officer, Chief Education Officer, District Social Welfare Officer, Chief Agricultural Officer, Deputy Drug Controller, ARTO, DDMO Srinagar, Incharge Drug De-addiction Centre SMHS Hospital, Incharge ATF, SKIMS Bemina and Officers from ANTF, Excise, Labour, DYSSO and other Departments.

At the outset, the Deputy Commissioner took a detailed appraisal from concerned members of NCORD Committee regarding implementation of the deterrence measures taken and progress achieved to eliminate drug abuse and its peddling from the Srinagar District particularly during the last 3 months. He also reviewed the present scenario of drug related occurrences,



hot spots of drug abuse, besides anti-drugs awareness campaign and drug deterrence measures in place in Srinagar District.

On the occasion, the DC emphasised the Officers including Enforcement agencies for taking concerted efforts to crack hotspots of drug abuse, obstruct drug-peddling, besides creating greater deterrence to combat dangerous trade of drug-trafficking.

The DC said menace of Drugs is non-negotiable and stressed on adopting zero tolerance against the drug abuse He also called the members of NCORD Committee to keep vigil on vulnerable places to prevent spread of drugs.

The DC called for attacking the societal issue of drug menace from both supply and demand sides to contain the drug peddling and break the supply chain. He also stressed upon the Officers of all the line Departments to further intensify the deterrence measures to control the harmful effects of drug menace so that youth is discouraged from tempting towards drugs

The DC also urged the

concerned to intensify the IEC campaign and install signages for awareness of target groups and also implement the Cigarettes and other Tobacco Products Act 2003(COTPA 2003), around the educational

institutions to prevent the

children/ youth from the

harmful effects of tobacco

and its products. During the meeting, a roadmap was discussed for making Drugs Free Panchayats in Srinagar District. The DC asked for undertaking an analysis study by the District Statistics & Evaluation Office to assess the drugs situation

in Srinagar District. Earlier, the DC was given feedback by the members of the Committee including Superintendent of Police, Incharge Drug **De-addiction Centre SMHS** Hospital, Incharge ATF, SKIMS Bemina, Deputy Drug Controller and other enforcement agencies, who presented the latest report related to action taken against drug addiction and drug trafficking in the last 3 months in Srinagar

The members of NCORD Committee also briefed about the presented the latest developments and strategies employed in the District to control drug addiction and its trafficking. He was informed that during the year 2022 as many as 1909 new patients (drug victims) visited the Drug De-addiction Centre SMHS Hospital, while in year 2023 only 728 such patients visited the Centre for treatment.

The Superintendent of Police apprised the meeting that as many as 107 cases have been registered in Srinagar District during current year and 186 drug peddlers have been booked under PITs-PSA and other Acts. In addition, huge quantity Contra Band substance were also seized/ recovered including 108 gms of brown sugar, 12.07 kgs Heroin, 11.81 Kgs of Charas, 19.5 Kgs of Fuki, 1361 PSY syrup bottles, 41812 PSY capsules/tablets, besides illicit cultivation of 7.16 Kgs Ganja, 2.09 quintals of bang/poppy straw/ cannabises were destroyed, in addition, to the cash recovery of Rs 26.46 lakh from the drug peddlers.

Similarly, the DC was informed that the Excise Department has destroyed wild bang spread over 350 kanals of land in Srinagar District, besides illicit poppy cultivation over 12.5 kanals of land during the current year. In addition, several awareness programmes regarding Narcotic Crops/Drug Abuse were also conducted.

Likewise, the DC was also briefed about the action taken and deterrence measures taken by the Anti-Narcotic Task Force(ANTF) to curb drug peddling in Srinagar District.

15 years on, NTPHC in Madwan still incomplete, people aghast

HAJIN: The New Type Primary Health Centre (NTPHC) in Madwan village of Hajin, located in North Kashmir's Bandipora district continues to remain incomplete even after 15 years with the result that people of the area are suffering a lot.

The locals said that construction on NTHPC began in 2008 and since then it continues to remain under construction even as very little work has taken place so far.

"The building remained non-functional over the years. Despite raising the issue with the relevant authorities several times, no action has been taken. A huge number of people are suffering due to non-availability of health facilities," they said.

The locals further said that the building, left unattended by the government, at times becomes a shelter for dogs, horses, and various other animals, which shows the administration's lack of seriousness regarding the overall healthcare facility in this rural area.

Shabir Ahmed, an elderly local said: "Even the windows and doors of this building are now visibly broken, and it seems neglected. No one is taking care of it. The government should demonstrate some seriousness and complete the remaining work to make it functional as soon as possible, enabling the locals to access healthcare services here.'

He said: "If NTPHC had been made functional, it could have been immensely beneficial to the residents of this hamlet and the nearby communities. The facility would have incorporated the latest amenities and specialized medical professionals". Ali Muhammad, another

local said: "During health emergencies, we are compelled to visit either Hajin Hospital or Bandipora even for minor ailments that could have been addressed here. However, going to other hospitals is challenging for us due to considerable distances," said Ali

t has become quite a natural instinct among a lot of youth in Kashmir to make terse comments on any Youtuber or Instagrammer without thinking about the consequences it can have on that person's mental health. Every person amongst us is a special human being and everyone wants to be famous or known. People post videos on YouTube and Instagram about their daily chores, videos about their aspirations, their goals, their attitudes, and their likes or dislikes. This choice needs to be respected by others.

Every one of us is not a master actor to be able to express our likes and dislikes tactfully. A good majority of us are people with average communication. But what is the sin if a person with average communicative ability wants to present his side of the worldview? His may not be a perfectly communicated commentary of his experience but then it is a narrative, a unique narrative of a unique person.

It is very sad to see some of us shamelessly indulging in cringe-worthy comments about the honest effort of a vlogger. For example, a vlogger went to Pahalgam and recorded the video. It definitely may not be the finest video you will see of Pahalgam - it is not expected to be so by any standards. You can open a savings bank account and learn money-management skills for your children. Encourage your child to practice a hobby like photography, gardening, hiking, or stargazing.

Take stock of the school work of the present academic session of your ward -Take time out to reflect on how well he/she fared in the last academic session and think deeply about the areas where your ward faltered and carefully consider how he/she can improve on those areas. Also, give due consideration to how to get going in your new session with a bang. Make your ward habitual to read offline or online daily newspapers to remain updated with the day-to-day happenings. Your ward should improve

vacation, allocate at least one hour every day to read as many books as possible to update yourself on current affairs. Read books on general knowledge, history, geography, science, and other subjects. The knowledge that you gain will stand you in good stead in the future. Besides students have had a lot of time confined in their homes where all they can do is play online games, chat with their friends, and watch TV

To improve the credibility of your ward, you can speak with his/her teachers to develop a study plan or request additional assignments. If your ward prepares early, it would be easier to excel in that particular area of study. Most schools administer exams shortly after the winter break, so the timing couldn't be better. Teachers can organize virtual sessions with the students, it would be better. Teachers understand children better than their parents. Depending on how well you know your students, what they love, and their experiences, set out to engage each of them at least once a week. Reach out to them to see how they are doing. schools reopen. When there is a strong relationship between teachers and students, communication becomes easy. Students will trust their teachers with secrets, sometimes including domestic issues that could derail their academic performance.

You can learn how to be of service to others. There is something about giving and bringing joy, and it is no different for your children. Teach your ward how to consider acts of kindness for a needy person or family in your community. Children can also be habit trackers to start a new daily routine like completing a weekly journal, purging their wardrobe, re-organize the room, learning a new language, joining a local or virtual book club, helping parents with household projects, start a vegetable garden, attend a festival, make a donation to a good cause, go skiing or hiking, and set new goals for the upcoming school year.

Winter vacations are a much-needed break from the daily routine, and they offer respite in terms of less work and more playtime for the children.

TB Eradication

Progress in Quantum Of Solace, Yet Glaring Gaps Persist

s the year 2023 comes to an end, it is indeed a quantum of solace moment in terms of finding all TB worldwide. Globally we could find a record number of new TB cases in a single year - historically. Over 7.5 million new TB cases were diagnosed in 2022 worldwide - the highest ever in the age-old fight against TB (as per the latest Global TB Report of the UN health agency, the World Health Organization (WHO) which was released in November 2023).

Finding more TB cases is an important benchmark but not able to find all TB cases continues to be worrisome. Out of the 10.6 million estimated people with TB, we at best have reached out to 7.5 million people

To end TB, we need to find all TB cases, diagnose all of them by using WHO-approved molecular tests upfront, and link them to the full cascade of effective treatment, care, and support services. Early and accurate TB diagnosis is a critical entry gate to the TB care pathway. It not only helps in reducing TB-related human suffering but also helps in stopping the spread of infection.

That is why WHO's highest level initiative – Find.Treat.All (first launched in 2018) - had called upon all governments to replace the old and poorly performing microscopy TB test with WHO-recommended rapid molecular tests by 2027. World leaders at the 2023 UN High-Level Meeting on TB had also re-echoed this call to completely phase out microscopy with upfront molecular test diagnosis for TB by 2027.

While we cheer those who have worked hard to find most TB in a single year historically, we also need to realise that we could have done much better.

Of the 7.5 million new people who were diagnosed with TB in 2022, only 47% were diagnosed using a WHO-recommended molecular test. In other words, more than half of them got the underperforming and outdated microscopy test. This is so unacceptable as we cannot afford to

Three important records set in India

India, which carries the highest TB burden globally, set three important records in 2022 as per the government's India TB Reports of 2022 and 2023.

Record-1: First, the good record. India saw the largest-ever rollout of WHO-recommended molecular tests across the nation. Lessons learned in India's rollout of molecular testing upfront for finding TB will be an important guiding light for so many

more high TB burden nations. Two Indian states (Goa and Lakshadweep) have completely phased out microscopy and transitioned to 100% use of molecular tests while one Indian state (Andhra Pradesh) is majorly using molecular tests (~70%) and has reduced microscopy. Most of the other Indian states have also increased the use of molecular tests manifold and are at different levels of scaling it up (but are they phasing

out microscopy?). Record-2: Second, the not-so-good record. While the use of molecular testing has seen a rapid rise, the country also increased (not decreased) the use of microscopy for finding TB to a record level in 2022. Over 13.9 million microscopy tests were done in 2022 in India (a record so far) as compared to 8.9 million such tests done in 2021 for finding TB. Earlier in 2018, India had recorded its previous high use of microscopy at 12.1 million.

Numbers do not always tell

the full story As per the WHO Global TB Reports, the use of upfront molecular tests in diagnosing TB rose globally from 38% in 2021 to 47% in 2022 an increase of 9%. In India, the use

of molecular tests grew from 22.4% in 2021 to 23% in 2022 - an increase of 0.6% - but the number 0.6% does not tell the real story. Let's dive a bit deeper.

Molecular testing grew by 82% in India in 2022 as compared to the levels in 2021 - this is the largest jump in molecular testing figures so far. But this feat is not reflected in the figure of "0.6%" (22.4% to 23%) increase during 2021-2022) when we compare the number of molecular tests done with the overall use of TB testing in the country in 2021 and 2022. This is because the creditable increase in molecular testing was offset by the meteoric rise in microscopy also. Microscopy should have reduced and not increased (both - in terms of proportion and numbers)! Thus, during 2021-22 the use of molecular tests in India grew at a record pace, but the growth in

microscopy was the steepest in 2022. As compared to 2021, in 2022 India increased the rollout of WHO recommended point-of-care, decentralized, and laboratory-independent molecular test Truenat by 90% (made by Molbio Diagnostics), and WHO recommended molecular test (which requires semi-centralised infrastructure) Gene Xpert by 67% (made by Cepheid). Microscopy increased during the same period by 68.1%. But when we look at absolute numbers, the rise in microscopy dwarfs the historic scale-up of molecular testing in India in 2022. Nearly 5.5 million more microscopies was done to find TB in 2022 compared to 2021.

diagnostic test for TB when WHOrecommended molecular tests exist. What does not exist is a proven track record globally to translate scientific breakthroughs into public health gains promptly. If we can ensure that WHO-recommended molecular tests are globally used upfront for every person with presumptive TB then when new TB tools come out of the research and development pipeline (such as TB vaccine) in the foreseeable future, we will have learned the pathway to reach the unreached. But as of now, this is not the case. Rollout of new health technologies (including COVID-19 vaccines) is marred with inequity. Making molecular TB testing available to all with presumptive TB will accelerate efforts to find all TB and link all of them to proper TB care cascade (and thus end TB). It is also an opportunity for world leaders to walk the talk on the equitable $\,$ rollout of health technologies.

Record-3: more quantum of solace: Thankfully, 2023 also saw Indian parliamentarians resonating the same level of commitment as the clarion call for a TB Free India given by the Indian Prime Minister. A Parliamentary Standing Committee Report which was presented to the Rajya Sabha and laid on the table of Lok Sabha on 21st September 2023, called upon the government to procure the #MadeInIndia and the WHO-recommended (one of its kind globally) point-of-care, decentralized, and laboratory independent molecular test Truenat "in bulk and supply the same at the minihealth centers also. This would aid in the earliest realization of upfront molecular testing across the country, which curbs the missing TB cases and simplifies the detection of drugresistant TB cases.

This report further recommended more investment in innovative TB diagnostic technologies. "Increased procurement of mobile diagnostic units with NAAT and hand-held x-rays for reaching out to remote or rural areas and other vulnerable areas" is in line with strong scientific evidence and already proven impact in active TB case finding worldwide.

Find all TB to stop TB The WHO's highest-level initiative which calls upon governments to replace microscopy 100% with upfront molecular testing for TB by 2027, was also endorsed by world leaders who committed to end TB at this year's UN High Level meeting. This call to replace microscopy 100% with upfront molecular testing is also echoed by over 400 endorsers of the Global Call to 'Find All TB to Stop TB' that was launched in Goa, India on 3rd November 2023 - www. bit.ly/findalltb. Africa launch of this call took place at the largest AIDS conference in Africa on 8th December 2023 (22nd International Confer-


ence on AIDS and STIs in Africa). This global call demands a paradigm shift from a lab-centric to a fundamentally people-centric model to find TB, leaving no one behind. It also reinforces the science-based call to reach the unreached by using WHO recommended point of care tools to screen and diagnose TB.

If we act upon this key ask, imagine the difference it will make when no TB case is missed, and all people with TB are brought in the care fold in a rights-based manner. A peoplecentric approach to finding all TB, treating all TB, and preventing TB is critical to end TB.

When the going gets tough, the tough get going

India has made historic progress in scaling up WHO-recommended molecular testing all across the country. With the strongest political commitment at the highest level and recommendations enshrined in the recent parliamentary committee report, 2024 could likely be a phenomenal year for finding all TB, treating all TB, and preventing all TB in India - a country that does not only have the highest TB burden but also a resolute will to build the strongest TB response to turn the tide and #endTB by 2025.



"Tobacco cessation services can be integrated into routine healthcare visits, reinforcing the importance of quitting and providing continuous support throughout a patient's healthcare journey," he said, adding that these centres can address co-occurring medical conditions associated with tobacco use, fostering a holistic approach to healthcare.

He further added that hospitals can contribute to research efforts by collecting data on tobacco cessation outcomes and this information can be valuable for refining intervention strategies and understanding the impact of cessation programs on various populations.

"Incorporating tobacco cessation centers into hospitals aligns with the broader goal of preventive healthcare and can significantly contribute to reducing the burden of tobacco-related diseases on both individuals and society," he said.

Atal Dulloo in a meeting to review the uptake and availability of digital services in the UT remarked that an in-house capacity building should be undertaken by the IT Department to offer genuine solutions to the users across cross-section of our society.

Besides the Commissioner Secretary, IT the meeting was attended by CEO, JaKeGA; SIO, NIC and other officers of the concerned departments.

He elaborated that after providing all the services to public through online

mode it is necessary to make their availability easier and faster for all the intending users of the UT. He exhorted that the information and assistance needed by people regarding agriculture, horticulture, skill development, entrepreneurship, credit and grievance resolution should be some of the focal points of this platform.

Dulloo stressed on devising an interactive mechanism for grievance redressal where the complainants are periodically apprised about the status of their grievances. He also asked for increasing and distributing the number of VLEs to ensure that far flung areas of the UT too had these in enough numbers to deliver services at the doorsteps of people.

In order to ensure timely delivery of e-services to the applicants without visiting offices physically, the Chief Secretary advised the concerned authorities for making stringent guidelines for compliance with timelines set under Public Service Guarantee Act (PSGA). He encouraged them to frame a list the erring officials habitual of breaching these timelines so that action warranted under law is taken against them.

Regarding the ease and accessibility of these services the Chief Secretary directed for simplifying the formats for all the applications to make them user-friendly for all the surfers. He asked for running sustained IEC campaigns for generating awareness in public regarding the benefits and availability of online services.

He even called for carrying out a study of all the services to check their penetration in all the districts along with uptake by users. He even asked for making a robust cyber security and Data Recovery plan for e-office. He told them to ensure that the backup of data is done on real time basis only.

In her presentation the Commissioner Secretary, Information Technology, Prerna Puri informed the meeting that the department has made a significant contribution by increasing the number of online services from 35 in 2019 to 1102 at present offered by 72 departments, PSUs, Universities, Colleges of the UT.

She also gave out that 485 services had been integrated with RAS for feedback of public and 387 with Auto-appeal system for ensuring their delivery as per the timelines defined under PSGA. She further informed that AQS for quality assessment of services by the users is also part of the digitisation to enable users to evaluate the services as per their experience.

She also highlighted that the Department is going to roll out the IVRS for real time grievance redressal and assistance for the public. She said that the suitable real time data recovery mechanism is also being explored by the Department besides implementation of robust cyber security management plan for the UT administration.

The meeting also discussed about the performance of offices onboard e-office. It also noted the uptake of Digi Dost facility administered through a toll free number (14471) across the $\overline{ ext{UT}}$ besides capacity building of users of e-office here.

Later in another meeting also attended by Principal Secretary, Forests; Secretary, Revenue and the Management of Telecom service provider, BSNL the Chief Secretary impressed upon the UT Administration to extend every kind of assistance to the telecommunication department.

He also directed the service provider to complete the work on all the handed over sites without any delay besides ensuring that the 4G saturation of all the villages as per the vision of Centrally Sponsored USOF are dully met.

He also stressed on smooth implementation of Bharat Net for coverage of all the habitations of the UT under broadband services to enhance the internet connectivity there without any further

Rajnath vows to 'catch from the seabed' those who attacked Indian ships with drones

MUMBAI: Taking a stern view of the recent drone attacks on two ships in the high seas, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Tuesday warned that they will not be spared and shall be given stringent punishment, as India is playing the role of a Net Security Provider for the entire Indian Ocean Region.

"The Indian Navy has increased surveillance of the seas... India has taken the recent drone attacks on 'MV Chem Pluto' in Arabian Sea and 'MV Sai Baba' in the Red Sea very seriously. Whoever has carried out these attacks, we will find them even if they are hiding on the seabed," thundered Singh.

The Chief of Naval Staff, Admiral Radhakrishnan Hari Kumar said that presently, India has deployed four latest warships to counter piracy and drone attacks on merchant shipping, besides the P8I Aircraft, Dorniers, Sea Guardians, Helicopters and Indian Coast Guard Ships, all join-

ing to counter these threats. The Defence Minister attributed the attacks to the increasing turbulence in the sea "owing to the growing economic clout and strategic power of India which has filled up some forces with jealousy and hatred," while commis-



sioning the latest and most potent warship, 'Imphal' to the Indian Navy here.

"We are in the role of the NSP for the entire IOR... We will ensure that the maritime trade in this region soars from the sea to the skies. For this, along with other friendly countries, we will keep the sea routes safe and secure for maritime commercial activities," assured Singh.

The Minister said that earlier, the country faced mostly land-based threats on the country's western and northern borders, and attention was given to the Indian Army and Indian

However, under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision underlining the importance of safeguarding the seas and oceans, equal attention is being paid to the Indian Navy.

"If we consider the movement of international goods from the geographical perspectives, due to the Himalayas in the north and a hostile Pakistan in the west, limited trade is possible there, and most of our goods come through the seas," Singh pointed out.

NEW DELHI: The government on Tuesday issued an advisory to all social media intermediaries, to ensure compliance with the existing IT rules and specifically target the growing concerns around misinformation powered by AI -- deepfakes.

The advisory mandates that intermediaries communicate prohibited content, particularly those specified under Rule 3(1) (b) of the IT Rules, clearly and precisely to users.

"A formal advisory has been issued incorporating the 'agreed to' procedures to ensure that users on these platforms do not violate the prohibited content in Rule 3(1)(b)," Minister of State for Electronics and IT, Rajeev Chandradekhar said.

"If such legal violations of the IT rules are noted or reported. then the consequences under law will follow," he added

The advisory emphasises that digital intermediaries must ensure users are informed about penal provisions, including those in the IPC and the IT Act 2000, in case of Rule 3(1)(b) violations.

"The users must be made aware of the various penal provisions of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) 1860, the IT Act, 2000 and such other laws that may be attracted in case of violation of Rule 3(1)(b). In addition, the terms of service and user agreements

must clearly highlight that intermediaries/platforms are under obligation to report legal violations to the law enforcement agencies under the relevant Indian laws applicable to the context," the advisory further added.

Rule 3(1)(b) within the due diligence section of the IT rules mandates intermediaries to communicate their rules, regulations, privacy policy, and user agreement in the user's preferred language.

They are also obliged to ensure reasonable efforts to prevent users from hosting, displaying, uploading, modifying, publishing, transmitting, storing, updating, or sharing any information related to the 11 listed user harms or content prohibited on digital intermediaries.

This rule aims to ensure platforms identify and promptly remove misinformation, false or misleading content, and material impersonating others, including deepfakes.

Over a period of one month, Chandrasekhar convened pivotal stakeholder meetings with industry leaders to address the pressing issue of deep-

During the meeting, he highlighted the urgency for all platforms and intermediaries to strictly adhere to the current laws and regulations, emphasising that the IT rules comprehensively address the menace of deepfakes.

Security scare at Israeli Embassy in Delhi proves false alarm

NEW DELHI: The Delhi Police went on high alert following an alleged bomb threat reported behind the Israeli Embassy in Chanakyapuri, the diplomatic enclave in the national capital.

The incident unfolded when an unidentified caller contacted the Delhi Fire Service around 5:45 p.m. on Tuesday, claiming the presence of a potential explosive device near the Israeli Embassy.

Responding swiftly, bomb squad units and police teams were dispatched to the location to conduct a thorough search




