

Kashmir Braces For Another Wet Spell

he news from the weatherman is not good. In all probability, Kashmir is preparing to brave for an extended spell of wet showers starting from 27th of April. The weatherman predicts showers would be moderate in the majority of the areas and high in a few. With snow beginning to melt and water level considerably high in our rivers this has set alarm bells ringing in various quarters of the social media and many are praying the showers to be of less intensity.

Just a decade or two back a spell or two of showers at this time of the year was welcomed with open arms. There was no cause to worry as the water-carrying capacity of river Jhelum was quite high. It was only if it rained continuously for about eight to ten days that the water level started hovering around the danger mark. But from the last decade, a two-day shower is enough to see the attached water level at various gauge stations darting about the danger mark. This is increasingly worrisome and has left the Srinagar basin at the mercy of showers in the upper southern mountain valleys. Also, the fact that the mountains were much more greener, there were plenty of trees which ensured that a lot of water did not reach the main river. Now with deforestation having reached scary levels a two-day spell of showers has the potential to bring about disaster.

Most of these predictions end up in a few spells of drizzles or passing showers at various times of the day. However, the fact that the water level in Jhelum is already high the administration would be well advised not to lower guard. The fact that this is a peak tourism season also is an important factor. The security of locals, as well as that of tourists, has to factor in all of the preparedness and estimation.

These showers would make it a little bit more difficult to haul out the dead bodies of people killed in the Gandbal boat tragedy. If only the water level recedes would it be easily to find the dead bodies of those who drowned in that incident. We hope that the dense clouds thin out and apart from a few spells of light rain there would no serious rain to threaten a flood. All hands in prayers!

"The Seventh Generation Principle comes from the Iroquois Confederacy Constitution, written somewhere between 1142 to 1500 AD. The Iroquois Confederacy is considered the oldest participative democracy on Earth. It planted many of the seeds that led to the formation of the United States. (There's a terrific PBS documentary on the Iroquois Great Law of Peace here.)

"Today the Seventh Generation Principle generally refers to decisions about our energy, water, and natural resources. Remembering this important tenet reminds us that our decisions must be sustainable for many generations to come. It also can be applied to relationships. Imagine what it would be like if every decision would result in sustainable relationships seven generations in the future!" - Dr. Kathy Allen, The Seventh Generation Principle.(CC)

'We' are like a virus pandemic that devastates the environment, it is overpopulation, pollution, burning fossil fuels and by deforestation that have caused climate change, soil erosion, poor air quality, and

undrinkable water.

Before coming to the issue of plastic pollution, we will mention that Deforestation, air pollution, global warming, water pollution, natural resource depletion are immensely demanding problems of our still beautiful looking planet from space. Earth.

Oil is formed as a result of heat and pressure on the remains of tiny sea plants and animals which lived, died and sank to the ocean floor millions of years ago and were buried deep under layers of sand and silt. Heat and pressure over millions of years turned these fossils into what we today call crude oil and gas. That's why oil and gas are called fossil fuels. The oil that is extracted by drilling deep into the earth is called crude because once it is extracted it has to be refined into petroleum products to be

Ever since we discovered how to extract and refine oil and make so many products from petroleum, we are more dependent on oil than we can imagine, we have been exploiting the oil wells at a higher rate every single year - and even though we have regularly discovered more and more oil fields and dug more and more oil wells and extracted more and more oil, our rate of demand is managing to outpace the oil produced.

The rate of oil 'production', meaning extraction and refining has grown almost every year of the last century. Our usage of petroleum products is so great that we could say that we are dependent on crude and

petroleum products to a point

when we cannot get out of it. Petrol for vehicles and for other major land and air transportation is not the only use of oil. Crude is refined into many petroleum products. Petrol for our vehicles is only one of them. There are several others - LPG, Naptha, kerosene, gas oil and fuel oil which have

widespread industrial uses. Lubricants and Tar/Asphalt for paving roads. Fertilisers and Pesticides in agriculture. Detergents and chemical fertilisers. Petro-chemicals are a

basis for perfumes etc. Other petroleum products such as Naptha, LPG and Ethane used in the production of petrochemicals such as Ethylene, Propylene, Butadiene, Benzene, Ammonia and Methanol – are the main ingredients in the manufacture of all plastic

Clothing And Textiles - Synthetic fibres which we wear and Synthetic rubbers. It's not just the blended polycloth it is also zippers, buttons, shoe-soles, pillow fillings etc. umbrellas etc. (Using cotton in many cases would save a lot of cotton farmers)

Offices – CD's, pens and ball pens, computers, telephones and so many office equipment including erasers which are

now made of petroleum based

synthetic material.
Play and Leisure – Board games, footballs, basketballs and for various games, playing cards, sleeping bags, tennis racquet strings, plastic flower pots, photo albums, cameras etc. all sorts of toys for children, dolls, rattles, pacifiers, feeding bottles etc.

Plastic pollution has become one of the most pressing environmental issues, as rapidly increasing production of disposable plastic products overwhelms the world's ability to deal with them.

It's not just plastic bags and packaging that is the prob-lem of plastic waste, there are bits and pieces of plastic everywhere, like the disposal of used computers, laptops, smartphones and so many other things we don't think about as plastic.

Plastics, once created, will stay around for hundreds of years. Plastics break down differently from other organic materials. They slowly degrade into smaller and smaller pieces of plastic known as microplastics and nano plastics and these minute pieces of plastic can now be found everywhere. from the oceans' depths and far deserts, to the most remote and

high mountaintop.

These tiny plastic particles are dangerous and have found their way into every step of the food chain, from marine life to human beings. They're found everywhere, from table salt to our food and bottled water. They pollute and poison environments and the animals that inhabit them.

Plastics is possibly the single most damaging products that humans have ever produced, and the damage it causes will last longer than we do.

So, what can we do? Consume resources responsibly consume less, waste less -Reduce – Reuse – Recycle

According to a report - Nairobi, 16 May 2023, by UN Environment Programme (UNEP). Plastic pollution could reduce by 80 per cent by 2040 if countries and companies make deep policy and market shifts using existing technologies.

The report suggests first eliminating problematic and unnecessary plastics to reduce the size of the problem. Subsequently, the report calls for three market shifts - reuse, recycle and reorient and diversify products:

Reuse: Promoting reuse options, including refillable bottles, bulk dispensers, depos-

it-return-schemes, packaging take-back schemes etc., can reduce 30 per cent of plastic pollution by 2040. Recycle: Reducing plastic

pollution by an additional 20 per cent by 2040 can be achieved if recycling becomes a more stable and profitable venture. Removing fossil fuels subsidies, enforcing design guidelines to enhance recyclability and other measures would increase the share of economically recyclable plastics from 21 to 50 per cent.

Reorient and diversify: Careful replacement of products such as plastic wrappers, sachets and takeaway items with products made from alternative materials (such as paper or compostable materials) can deliver an additional 17 per cent decrease in plastic pollution.

We need to think long term; understand the significance of our actions and really care about their consequences. We've got to give up shortterm thinking, and improve our ability to plan and design for long term, and work with good intentions and reverence for nature.(CC)

Protect The Arctic Region

Arctic Ecology Can Be Devastated Further By Rapid Militarization

he Arctic region is warming at twice the global rate, leading to rapid melting of ice-some have even predicted ice-free summers by year 2034. This has brought unprecedented threats to various species of the region including the polar bear. Some species are threatened by the shrinking, even vanishing habitats where they have always lived safely and happily, some are threatened by the fast reducing access to their staple food, while some are threatened by weather extremes.

Despite this there is still relent less march to exploit the vast natural resources of the region, including oil, natural gas, rare earth and other minerals. Partly due to the huge natural resources and partly due to strategic and geo-political reasons, big power confrontation in this remote region can also increase. In fact melting of ice increases the possibility of higher exploitation of natural resources as well as carving out of new maritime routes with all its strategic and commercial implications. Another complication is the increasing confrontational situation of NATO and Russia which may get extended, tragically, even to the Arctic region with very heavy costs to ecology and to native

The Arctic region is spread over 8 countries 7 of which are NATO members. These are USA, Canada, Iceland, Denmark (Greenland), Norway, Sweden and Finland. The eighth country is Russia. While Russia has a wellestablished military presence here, this is largely defensive as Russia has important strategic interests to protect here spread over a vast area. With Finland and Sweden recently becoming NATO members and with the situation in Ukraine not working out to be favorable to NATO plans, the USA may just be tempted to try to create difficulties for Russia in this region. Russia may respond by giving more opportunities to China to acquire a presence here. One move by one side may lead to another move by the other side and very soon the situation may become much more tense and risky.

This should be avoided in the interests of world peace as well as the considerations of protecting Arctic ecology. Not just actual conflict but even large-scale military exercises may prove to be quite harmful for Arctic ecology. Under the Nordic Response 2024 exercise in Norway, in March as many as about 20,000 soldiers from 13 NATO member countries were gathered in the Arctic region with frigates, submarines and other vessels, and over 100 aircraft. This is likely to ultimately increase to about 90,000

A high-risk situation already exists here in which climate change and global warming first create conditions in which exploitation of natural resources and militarization are likely to increase more, and this trend in turn greatly increases the possibilities of global warming further, apart from destruction of local environment and life-species in more direct ways as well. All this should be avoided. With due caution and by ensuring there is no undue suspicion of each other's intentions, conflict in this region can be avoided as both sides also recognize hopefully how costly in economic as well as in ecological terms, above all of course in terms of loss of human lives, conflict in such a region is likely to prove. Special mechanisms should be in place to minimize militarization and the possibility of any conflict breaking out here.

Further we look here at the various high risks that have already occurred in recent times in this region in more details in the context of a part of this region—Greenland. Very high rate of ice melting has been reported here even melting of as much as 18 billion



tons of ice sheets in just 3 days of mid-July in Greenland. Very frightening estimates have been presented of the extent of rise in sea level if melting on such a scale continues.

It was reported that Donald Trump made an offer of a payment to Denmark to acquire control over Greenland. This was considered an atrocious offer by most people and for good reason was not even considered seriously by the Denmark government. This even led to the cancellation of a planned visit of President Trump to Denmark, Although Denmark controls the foreign policy and security of this vast island, Greenland has been moving towards autonomy and selfgovernment.

However, it is not difficult to under-

With its strategic location close to Russia as well as the USA, Greenland remains of great military interest to the USA. This is a factor that has acquired more significance recently with the accentuation of big-power rivalries

In addition, Greenland is a source of precious mineral resources, including gold and rare earths. The opening up of these rare earth deposits to China is something that the Western powers will like to stop, given the fact that China already has high levels of control over rare earths.

Greenland has a population of just 57000 people in its vast territory of 836330 sq. miles and has the lowest population density in the entire world. This Arctic region is highly sensitive

Hence there is a strong case for the entire Greenland to be administered by the United Nations as a zone of neutrality, peace, and environment protection. Under such an arrangement, ecologically protective livelihoods and basic facilities will be ensured by a UN-administered program, which will treat the entire island as an area of ecological protection where any exploitation of natural resources will be strictly controlled and no military installation will be allowed. In addition, there will be a very careful wellplanned effort for undoing the damage already done.

As the snow melts with global warming, the remains of what was once a nuclear-powered military sta-

air all the time and the Thule military base in Greenland was a special place for these operations due to the relative proximity of Russian targets from here. The airplane accident took place when the USA bomber containing nuclear weapons was approaching this military base in Greenland. The USA had obtained the permission of the Denmark government to set up this military base but it is not at all certain whether the Denmark govern-ment, let alone the local communities, had been informed about the transactions here involving the transport of nuclear weapons.

Actually, the plane contained four nuclear weapons but three could be recovered. In the salvage operation in 1968 thousands of pieces of debris as well as millions of tons of ice, suspected to contain radioactive debris, were collected. Still, one weapon could not be found despite the huge research effort. Workers employed in the cleanup work suffered from cancer later and have been claiming compensation till recently.

It is by now widely accepted that in this accident as many as four nuclear weapons were endangered, three were recovered more or less intact but one hydrogen bomb was never recovered. One aspect of a UN-administrated protective future should be to remain on constant alert for any tell-tale signs of damage from this so that a potential catastrophic event can still be

The existing military installations particularly the Thule Military Base should also be dismantled as part of the efforts to establish Greenland as a zone of peace and neutrality. While the wider paradigm of future development should be based on ecological protection, protective livelihoods, peace, and neutrality, within this paradigm local people should have all the autonomy for highly decentralized governance. There should be a special program of mental health and well-being to bring down the high rate of suicides and substance abuse in

Clearly, there are several serious issues in Greenland that have to be sorted out. A big effort with continuity has to be made to ensure a more protective future for Greenland which is in fact crucial for the entire world. (C--Counter Currents)

This constituency consists of 11 Assembly segments of Jammu district including Bishnah, Suchetgarh, Ranbir Singh Pura (Jammu-south), Bahu, Jammu East, Nagrota, Jammu West, Jammu North, Marh, Akhnoor and Chamb, three Assembly segments of Samba district including Ramgarh, Samba and Vijaypur, three Assembly segments of Reasi district including Gulabgarh, Reasi and Shri Mata Vasihno Devi and one Assembly segment of Rajouri district Kalakote-Sunderbani.

According to the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) J&K, around 2,416 polling stations have been established all across three districts and one Assembly segment of Rajouri district to ensure smooth polling. More than 15000 polling staff, including reserves will be deployed on duty on the polling day and the election staff including Presiding Officers will be stationed in every polling station.

Around 50 polling stations have been established in border areas of Jammu district whereas 2 such polling stations are there in Samba district.

The voting will begin at 7 am and the first voter will be provided a rose at every polling station and the polling will continue till 6 pm. The voting will go beyond 6 pm if there will be voters' queue is still there inside the polling station premises. Before the polling begins, a mock polling drill will be held at every polling station to test the prepared-

To facilitate the smooth polling, the election commission of India has provided Assured Minimum Facilities (AMF) like drinking water, electricity, toilet, ramp, furniture, verandah, sheds besides wheelchairs will also be provided to the needy. The ballot unit will also have a list of contesting candidates in brail script. Wherever required, there will be separate queues for senior citizens and specially-abled persons facilitating them with early polling. Additionally, there will be a voter help desk, manned by the concerned Booth Level Officer (BLO).

On the directions of ECI, 10 Pink booths, which will be managed by only women staff for women voters, have been established in the constituency whereas 10 booths have been established particularly for speciallyabled voters. The ECI has also established nine booths for the youth.

The voter can carry any of the 12 types of document which can establish his identity to the polling station and the electoral photo identity card (EPIC) hasn't been made mandatory for the ECI

Besides, the Voter Turnout App will be used to display estimated provisional voter turnout details of each Parliamentary Constituency entered by the Returning Officer (RO). The approximate voter turnout data of each phase of the elections will be displayed through this app. There will be two hourly reporting of voting percentage from 9.00 am to the end of the poll. The concerned ARO and RO will share the data with the media accordingly.

Around 1454 polling stations in phase 2 will have CCTV cameras for live webcasting to control rooms established at the District and CEO office. Around 124 polling stations will have two cameras for inside and outside surveillance. Around 2000 vehicles of Polling parties and sector officers will be equipped with a GPS system so as to locate the vehicle and monitor movement, including over speeding. Satellite Phones, Wireless sets and Special Runners have been put in place in around 13 polling stations which fall in communication shadow areas—(KNO)

Border Residents

Out of the 18 Assembly segments of Jammu constituency, nine segments have votes in border areas, both on IB and LoC. These include Ramgarh and Samba Assembly segments of Samba district, Bishnah, Suchetgarh, Ranbir Singh Pura, Marh, Akhnoor and Chamb of district Jammu and Sunderbani-Kalakote Assembly segment of Rajouri district





Traffic plying on just 5.5 meter road surface on busiest highway in Sgr

SRINAGAR: With an aim to bring respite to the commuters, the twin underconstruction flyovers at Bemina and Nowgam are set to be completed and thrown open for the public within the next two months.

The authorities in the Roads and Building department informed that the work on the two flyovers including Bemina and Nowgam is in the final stage.

"In case the weather remains favourable, we are expecting to complete the two overpasses either in the month of May or June this year," Ashiq Ahmad, Executive Engineer, R&B Project Division 1st.

"The rains are delaying the work. We have to keep everything in mind. At present the traffic which was plying on the 21 meter road is now plying on just a 5.5 meter road, thereby leading to the traffic congestion," he said, adding that they don't want any

lacuna while constructing the flyovers.

Besides, he stated that the utility shift is one among the reasons, which has delayed the process, saying that "at a time when the flyover is under construction, we have to take every precaution and ensure that macadamized roads after its completion are not dug for the utility

shifts." Appealing to people to cooperate with the department for just a few more months, he said that they are aware of the facts that

the people are suffering due to the traffic congestion, but once the road is completed, the commuters will have a smooth and hassle-free movement.

"The riding surface 5.5 meter available space for commuters will be macadamized on priority so that the traffic will flow smoothly during the construction period," he said.

About Sanatnagar flyover, he said that the work on it was started after Bemina and Nowgam flyovers, but the work is going on at a fast pace and it will

be completed later this

However, SE South, Rajinder Kumar Gupta when contacted, told KNO that the Sanatnagar flyover cannot be completed this year, but is expected to be completed in the month of March next year.
