## PM Modi Led Govt's Tough Stand On Terror In J&K Unmatched: Amit Shah

'During Congress Rule, Terrorists Played Khoon Ki Holi Across India'



**SRINAGAR:** Asserting that India now responds to terror threats with unprecedented resolve and strength, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday said the PM Modi-led government's action against terrorism in J&K is unlike anything seen in decades.

Addressing a public rally in Taraiya, Bihar, Shah, said, "During the Congress rule, terrorists played 'khoon ki holi' (blood-soaked Holi) across India. Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, we entered their homes and wiped them out through 'Operation Sindoor.

He said that terrorists involved in the Pahalgam terror attack were brought to justice under 'Operation Mahadev,' and their handlers were also targeted inside Pakistan. "The way Modi ji responded to terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir, no one did in the past several decades," he added.

Highlighting the government's achievements, the Home Minister said the abro-



gation of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir was a historic decision that permanently integrated the region with the rest of the country. "From removing Article 370 to fighting terrorism, we have acted on every front. When terrorists tried to rise again, we launched Operation Sindoor and taught

them a lesson in their own

homes," Shah said.

He said the government ended the practice of triple talaq, giving justice to Muslim women, and after 350 years fulfilled the long-standing promise of building the Ram Temple in Ayodhya.

Shah also accused opposition parties of misleading people with "unrealistic

promises" and reviving what he described as the politics of corruption and fear

He said the regime led by PM Modi remains focussed on development, welfare, and national security.

## **Congress Denies Rift With NC, Says** Will Continue Despite Differences

SRINAGAR: Amid growing speculation over cracks in the Congress-National Conference (NC) alliance, the Congress on Friday said that the partnership between the two parties will continue for the greater common good.

Congress General Secretary, Ghulam Ahmad Mir told the media persons, that internal differences do not mean the alliance is breaking apart.

"Leaders express their opinions—some support one side, some the other—but there are proper party forums and authorized persons to speak on such matters," he said.

Mir explained that Congress had asked for a specific Rajya Sabha seat but could not reach an agreement with the NC. "The fourth seat was given according to their own calculations. Our top leadership had decided



that if we were not given what was rightfully ours, we would not contest. That was a party

decision," he said. He dismissed speculation about the alliance collapsing; saying disagreements on one issue should not be seen as a split. "If we focus on just one

issue, no one achieves any major goal," Mir said.

He said that both parties remain united against the BJP. "We will not let the BJP's designs or their communal agenda succeed in Jammu and Kashmir. Internally, we may have differences, but • P-06

#### **NIA Charges Migrant Labourer For Conspiring With LeT**

**NEW DELHI:** The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a chargesheet against a migrant labourer from Bihar for allegedly supporting proscribed terrorist organisations, including Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), in Jammu and Kashmir and Tamil Nadu.

The accused, identified as Akhalatur, alias Mohammed Akhlaque Mujahid, a resident of Katihar district, Bihar, has been charged under Sections 196 and 197 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and Sections 13(1) (b) and 39 of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. The chargesheet was filed today before the NIA Special Court at Poonamallee, Chennai, Tamil Nadu.

Mujahid, employed as a labourer at a private construction site in Chengalpattu, Tamil Nadu, was arrested in April by Kayar Police for his involvement in antinational activities. The case was subsequently taken over by the NIA due to its gravity.

Opaque Voting Rules Put Spotlight On 7 Non-Party MLAs IBNI MAQBOOL

**SRINAGAR:** The National Conference (NC) and Congress made last-ditch efforts to forge unity ahead of the Rajya Sabha polls, following Congress's public announcement that it would not contest the 'riskier' fourth seat. As a result of negotiations, Congress leaders claim they had nearly agreed to field a candidate for the competitive seat; however, the issue of independents played spoilsport in the final moments of the unity talks. The differences arose from the voting method of independent MLAs, who are not required to show their marked ballots to polling agents-unlike party-affiliated legislators.

With the Rajya Sabha election just a week away, all eyes are on seven independent MLAs-five of whom support the gov-

#### Budgam By-Election

#### NC, PDP Yet To Nominate **Candidates As Deadline Nears**

BUDGAM: As the last date for filing nomination papers for the Budgam by-election approaches, the two major regional parties including National Conference (NC) and Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) are yet to officially declare their candidates.

Speculations are rife that the National Conference may field Aga Syed Mehmood, though party sources said that the final decision is expected within the next 24 hours.

In the 2024 General Assembly elections, PDP's Aga Syed Muntazir Mehdi had secured 17,525 votes from Budgam, while NC's Omar Abdullah bagged 36,010 votes and won the seat by a significant margin.

Omar Abdullah, however, chose to retain his Ganderbal seat, leaving the Budgam constituency vacant. The Budgam seat fell vacant on October 21, 2024, after Chief Minister Omar Abdullah retained the



Ganderbal constituency following his dual victory in last year's Assembly elections.

Meanwhile, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has already announced Aga Syed Mohsin as its candidate for the Budgam by-polls.

Muntazir Mohiuddin, who was earlier associated with the Apni Party has also confirmed his decision to contest as an independent candidate.

Another independent candidate, Jibran Dar, has filed his nomination papers today at the Returning Officer's office in Budgam, • P-0

# **Judicial Academy organizes orientation** programme on "Medico-Legal Aspects in Trial"

SRINAGAR: The Jammu & Kashmir Judicial Academy, Srinagar, organized a One Day Special Orientation Programme on "Medical Forensics & Medico-Legal Aspects in Trial, Different Dimensions of Cyber Crimes and Electronic

The programme was organized under the patronage of Chief Justice, High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh (Patron-in-Chief, J&K Judicial Academy), Justice Arun Palli and under the guidance of the Chairperson and Members of the Governing Committee of the Academy, for Judicial Officers of the District Judiciary of Kashmir Province including UT of Ladakh. Public Prosecutors. Additional Public Prosecutors. Assistant Public Prosecutors. and Investigating Officers of Kashmir Province.

The programme commenced with introductory remarks by Director, J&K Judicial Academy, Sonia Gupta, who outlined the objectives of the orientation programme. She emphasized that in the age of digital

forensic technologies, the judiciary and prosecution must stay equipped with evolving scientific, medical, and technological developments that critically shape the administration of criminal justice.

Speaking on the occasion, Senior Assistant Professor, School of Law, University of Kashmir, Dr. Mir Junaid Alam focused on the theme "Demystifying the Information Technology Act, 2000 with Reference to Cyber Crimes viz. Issues, Challenges and Way Forward.

He discussed the legal and procedural complexities arising from cyber offences, data breaches, and online frauds. He also highlighted the gaps between technology and enforcement and emphasized the need for judicial officers and investigators to enhance their understanding of digital footprints, data preservation, and admissibility of electronic

In his address, he also underscored the importance of judicial sensitivity to privacy, digital rights, and due process in

cases involving cybercrime. Senior Assistant Professor. Centre for Distance and Online Education, University of Kashmir, Dr. Aneeda Jan deliberated on "Medical Forensic Law: Constitutional Perspective and Role

of Judiciary" and "Impact of

Technology on Forensic Evi-

dence. She elaborated on the

intricate relationship between law and forensic medicine. underscoring the critical role of medical evidence in the dispensation of justice.

Further, she spoke on the constitutional and ethical dimensions of forensic investigation, highlighting the responsibility of courts to ensure the integrity, authenticity, and admissibility of forensic materials.

Discussing technological advances, she pointed out how digital imaging, DNA analysis, and AI-based diagnostic tools are transforming medico-legal practices and judicial evaluation of evidence.

Registrar Vigilance, High Court of J&K and Ladakh, Rajeev Gupta addressed on the topic "Electronic Evidence: Definitions and Characteristics". He outlined the essential

bility of electronic evidence. He also discussed judicial precedents governing elec-

requirements for the admissi-

ity of digital signatures, and challenges in verifying metadata and data chain integrity. He stressed that the digital age demands a deeper understanding of technological processes to prevent miscarriage of justice due to procedural lapses in electronic documentation and certification.

The programme concluded with an interactive session and feedback, during which participants shared insights and discussed practical challenges faced in handling medico-legal cases and cybercrime trials. The deliberations reinforced the need for continued judicial and prosecutorial training to ensure that the justice delivery system keeps pace with advancements in forensic science and technology.

The event reflected the Academy's commitment to fostering interdisciplinary knowledge among judicial and legal officers, enabling them to uphold procedural fairness, scientific accuracy, and technological competence in the dispensation of justice.

The next phase of training is scheduled to continue in the



## The Great GST **Paradox**

hen the Prime Minister announced a substantial slash in the GST slab on medicines and medical equipment, the move was hailed as a major relief for the common man. It was expected to bring down the medical burden on households already crushed under rising costs of healthcare. Yet, in a shocking twist, the reality on the ground paints an entirely different picture — instead of prices coming down, rates have shot up across most medical stores and diagnostic outlets.

This paradox has left the people baffled. How can medicines become costlier when the tax burden has been reduced? The answer lies somewhere between greed, inefficiency, and lack of oversight. Traders and distributors, instead of passing on the benefit to the end consumer, appear to have taken undue advantage of the confusion to inflate prices. Regulatory agencies, who should have been on their toes to ensure compliance, are either looking the other way or pretending ignorance.

The health sector in India, particularly in regions like Jammu and Kashmir, has long suffered from weak regulation and unmonitored profiteering. Every time a policy reform is announced with good intent, the middlemen and retailers find ways to twist it to their benefit. The same story seems to be repeating with the GST relief on medicines.

The government must immediately step in to audit the pricing chain from manufacturers to pharmacies. A transparent mechanism should be put in place to ensure that GST reductions actually reflect in the bills of ordinary citizens. Otherwise, the purpose of such reforms is defeated, and the trust of the people erodes further.

When health becomes a business of manipulation and deceit, society is in serious trouble. The so-called "relief" has turned into yet another tool of exploitation — and that is a tragedy no tax policy can justify.

# Taking Molecular TB Diagnostics Closer To People


n important scientific study published in The Lancet shows the strong public health impact of deploying molecular diagnostics closer to the people. This multi-country randomised controlled study shows that if we deploy battery-operated, laboratory independent and true point-ofcare molecular test Truenat at the primary healthcare level, then same day test and treat can become a reality. Diagnosing TB early and accurately is a critical pathway towards right treatment as well as stopping the spread of infection.

The study enrolled around 4000 participants in 29 primary healthcare clinics of Tanzania and Mozambique during August 2022 and June 2023. In one study-arm, 2007 participants were accessing primary healthcare clinics equipped with point-of-care molecular test Truenat. In the second studyarm, 1980 people were served by primary healthcare clinics with no molecular test, but their samples were collected and sent to a laboratory with molecular test Gene Xpert (11-16 km away) and their test reports transported back. Both these molecular tests

are WHO recommended ones. The study found that 97% of TB patients could begin treatment within 7 days when point-of-care Truenat was deployed at the primary care level. But only 63% could do so when samples were sent to a remote lab where Gene Xpert was deployed. More importantly, 82.2% of the TB patients who were diagnosed with Truenat at the primary care level, could be initiated on right TB treatment on the same day - so, same day test and treat could become a reality in remote peripheral settings. But only 3% could get same day treatment initiation if tested by Gene Xpert deployed in a remote

Study authors categorically state that "this study provides strong evidence supporting the placement of low complexity molecular TB diagnostics at primary care level, to enable same-day diagnosis and treatment initiation." TB deaths were 3-fold among those who were in the study-arm where samples were to be sent to a remote lab equipped with Xpert (2.1%) compared to those who were in the study-arm with Truenat deployed at the primary care level (0.7%). Eliminating diagnostic delays and delays between diagnosis and treatment can

By not deploying point-of-care molecular TB tests we are programming to fail on "same day test and treat" too – and thereby failing to reduce unnecessary human suf-



fering and risk of untimely death due to TB. Also, we cannot break the chain of infection transmission unless we diagnose TB early and accurately and initiate right treatment without any delay.

Study authors observed that "we found that the placement of the Truenat platform with MTB Plus and MTB-RIF Dx assays at clinics combined with rapid communication of results and same-day TB treatment initiation led to a 1.5 times higher proportion of people starting treatment for microbiologically confirmed TB within 7 days." It is also important to note that study researchers had found major problems with sputum transport systems which negatively impacted the TB programme. Study authors noted that "study site assessments revealed operational issues [with Gene Xpert] (for example, sputum container stockouts and delays in sample transport) leading to occasional referral of patients instead of samples. To address this issue, sputum containers were stocked throughout, and samples were collected at least twice weekly. Off-site labora-tories received Xpert MTB/RIF Ultra cartridges for sample testing.

So, even if so-called hub-and-spoke model or sputum referral system works 'perfectly' (like in this study) then too TB programme outcomes are majorly compromised. One can imagine when real life problems mar this hub-and-spoke model then TB programme outcomes would be getting even more compromised. In the study-arm where Truenat was deployed at the primary care level, it took an hour to find if a person has active TB disease (and if so, then whether the TB bacteria is resistant to one of the two most effective anti-TB medicines, rifampicin). The person was asked to wait for one hour and if found positive for TB, then treatment could be initiated on the same day for over 82% patients.

This Lancet publication co-authored

by Dr Celso Khosa of Instituto Nacional de Saúde in Mozambique, Dr Adam Penn-Nicholson of FIND in Geneva, and other researchers from several medical and scientific institutions, is among the very few studies that have compared the difference it makes by deploying molecular diagnostics at primary care level with off-site remote laboratory with centralised or semi-centralised molecular testing (and samples sent to the lab and reports back to the peripheral clinic). Most other studies have compared the difference between a bad TB upfront test (sputum microscopy, which badly underperforms in diagnosing TB) at primary care level with off-site molecular testing.

Truenat molecular test is also the largest used molecular test deployed in India - a nation home to world's largest number of people with TB. It is deployed in over 90 countries now. For example, the largest rollout of Truenat in Africa took place last year in Nigeria with AI-enabled handheld X-Rays and solar-power charging capabilities in remote peripheral areas.

Ahead of the world's biggest TB and

lung disease conference (Union World Conference on Lung Health) that will be held next month, this study published in the Lancet provides potentially groundbreaking scientific evidence for high TB burden countries on the major difference it makes by deployment of WHO recommended point-of-care molecular test Truenat at the primary care level. If we are to serve the underserved, take best of healthcare and social support services with equity, rights and human dignity. If we are to end TB we cannot afford any delays - be they diagnostic delays or delays spanning many days between diagnosis and initiation of treatment. Moreover, deploying point-of-care health technologies at the point-of-need helps break the barriers people face in accessing centralised healthcare services.

All world leaders at the United Nations General Assembly High Level Meeting on TB in 2023 had committed to completely replace microscopy with upfront molecular TB tests by 2027. With the light this study shines on bringing molecular tests to the primary care level, all efforts must be full throttle to replace microscopy with pointof-care molecular tests that are deployable in high-burden settings.

Study authors stated: "Although Xpert MTB/RIF, endorsed by WHO in 2011, revolutionised TB and rifampicin resistance detection, its impact has been limited. High costs and operational requirements (eg, stable electricity, temperature control, and dust-free environments) have confined its use to centralised laboratories in hub-andspoke models. New molecular and point-ofcare diagnostics are emerging that might be deployed in primary care clinics or even in communities. Portable battery-operated molecular testing platforms, such as the Molbio Truenat platform (endorsed by WHO in 2020), offer the potential to further decentralise molecular testing.

This randomized control study provides pathbreaking science to call for transforming every 'spoke' into a hub by deploying WHO recommended point-of-care molecular tests like Truenat which are battery-operated (with solar power recharging capabilities), laboratory independent, and decentralised. More importantly, it is a multidisease molecular testing platform for over 40 diseases, such as TB, HIV (including viral load, testing) hepatitis B and C virus, human papilloma virus (HPV - which causes a lot of cervical cancers), several sexually transmitted infections, leprosy, vector-borne diseases like malaria, among others.

Earlier this week while launching an important WHO report on antimicrobial resistance, WHO Director General Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus too had underpinned the importance of "rapid and point-of-care molecular testing" for preventing AMR - because correct and timely diagnosis for multiple diseases must be made accessible to all equitably especially those who are underserved. Linkage to standard treatment, care and support also should be made accessible to all if we are to prevent AMR, along with optimal infection prevention and control, vaccination, water, sanitation and hygiene, and other health and

## Poverty: The Deepest Stain On Humanity

very year, the global community observes October 17 as the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty. This day is not merely a ritual of remembrance—it is a moment of deep reflection on one of the greatest moral and social challenges before humanity. Despite centuries of civilization, rapid technological progress, and growing global wealth, millions across the world continue to live without access to the most basic human needs-food, shelter, clothing, education, and healthcare. Poverty is not merely an economic condition; it is a wound on human dignity. It crushes dreams, weakens confidence, and undermines the very essence of human existence. Recognizing this, the United Nations General Assembly declared 17 October as a day to promote dialogue and action for eradicating poverty in 1992. The theme for 2025, "Ending Social and Institutional Abuse by Ensuring Respect and Effective Support for Families," underlines that poverty is not only about income but also about inclusion, equality, and justice.

Today, over 700 million people still live in extreme poverty. The UN's Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) aims to eliminate extreme poverty by 2030, yet that dream remains distant. Wars, climate change, rising inequality, unemployment, and flawed economic policies continue to reinvent poverty in new and more complex forms. As Nobel laureate Amartya Sen rightly said, "Poverty is not just lack of

income; it is the deprivation of freedom." True poverty begins when a person is denied the opportunity to shape his or

her life freely and with dignity. India has made remarkable progress in reducing poverty over the past few decades. According to the NITI Aayog, multidimensional poverty fell from 29% in 2013–14 to about 11% in 2019-21. Yet, the story is incomplete. Poverty still hits rural populations, women. Dalits, and tribal communities hardest. Its worst impact is visible in education and health where poor children drop out of schools and families collapse under medical costs, creating an unending cycle of deprivation. In the "Amrit Kaal"—the 25 years leading to India's 100th year of independence—the vision of a "Viksit Bharat" (Developed India) must also mean a "Garib-Mukt Bharat" (Poverty-Free India). Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, poverty eradication has become not just a government initiative but a national mission.

Between 2005 and 2020, nearly 410 million Indians rose above the poverty line. The Modi government's programs have transformed welfare into empowerment. The Jan Dhan-Aadhaar-Mobile (JAM) trinity connected millions of poor families to formal banking systems, ensuring transparency and direct benefit transfers. The Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana turned the dream of owning a home into reality for over 4 crore families, while the Ujjwala Yojana freed millions of women from the suffocating smoke of traditional stoves-



offering not just fuel but dignity. Similarly, the Ayushman Bharat health scheme and PM Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana provided a lifeline during the pandemic. The Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan (Self-Reliant India Campaign) has redefined the battle against povertylinking it to skill development, employment, and self-respect. As the Prime Minister aptly stated, "To eliminate poverty, the government alone is not enough; society must become sensitive. When every poor person's dream becomes our dream, only then will India truly prosper.'

#### Prophet Of Progress

# Why Sir Syed's Vision Matters More Than Ever

s a student at Aligarh Muslim University (AMU), it is meaningful to observe 17 October as birthday of Sir Syed Ahmed Khan, whose society and contribution could be labeled as Eid-e-Alig. On his 208th birthday, we keep his struggles in perspective, particularly on his day. Sir Syed Ahmed Khan was born into a respected family in Delhi in 1817 and received traditional Islamic education, studied both Persian and Arabic. Early in life he showed an enthusiasm for modern scientific pursuits and Western education. As a young person, he joined the British administration as a subordinate judge in Ghazipur, where his occupation led him to be familiar with the social, educational and political condition of the Indians and Muslim

After the decline of the Mughal Empire, and the decline of Muslim society, he noticed the divide and the destruction of community bounds to develop with the British and surely became concerned with the Muslim society. Before the Revolt of 1857 and during the British expansion, Khan was an advocate for Muslims to adopt modern education, learning English and the blessings of scientific study, which was the foundation to his later enterprise of social and educational

In the aftermath of the Revolt of 1857, the world of India had crumbled. Delhi lay vacant, the Mughal crown was shattered, and the Muslims of North India had lost their power, property and pride. From those ashes stood a guiet reformer named Sir Syed Ahmad Khan. He realized that the struggle for honour would no longer be lived on the battlefield, but in the

For Sir Syed, the path to renaissance travelled through the mind. He was not a revolutionary but rather, a reconstructionist who wanted to rebuild a traumatized community through education, reason and conversation. However, it was the same pragmatism that made him a visionary that also made him a target. The detractors of Sir Syed thought of him as a loyalist who had too much in common with the British, an elitist who turned his back on the poor, and someone limited in his thinking who had emphasized Muslim identity and inadvertently left the door open for impending communal division.

A hundred years later, as India discusses education, identity, and secularism yet again, his life calls for a new assessment. After 1857, Muslims were cast as the primary perpetrators of the revolt. Sir Syed, who had seen the chaos in Delhi up close, understood that his community could not go through another round of violence. His pamphlet Asbab-e-Baghawat-e-Hind (The Causes of the Indian Revolt) was radical for its day:



he attributed the revolt not to native "fanaticism," but to British administrative hubris and cultural arrogance. Still, he couched this criticism in

He concluded that the only way was education. In 1875, he started the Muhammadan Anglo-Oriental College, which would grow into Aligarh Muslim University (AMU). The promise was radical: to create and integrate Western sciences and Islamic morals, with a generation empowered by both faith and reason.

Through his journal Tahzib-ul-Akhlaq, he urged Muslims to reject superstition and exercise reason. For him, science and religion were not antithetical. "The Quran," he wrote, "invites man to study nature, for both are creations of God." The rationalization of belief became his intellectual

Sir Syed's reforms angered both conservatives and nationalists. The orthodox ulema of his time condemned him as a heretic for questioning literal interpretations of miracles and angels. The Deoband movement, founded around the same period, argued that his ideas diluted Islam under the influence of the West. From the nationalist camp, figures like Bal Gangadhar Tilak and later Maulana Azad accused him of dividing India along religious lines. His refusal to join the Indian National Congress in 1885 which he saw as premature and dominated by the Hindu elite was read as a precursor to the "two-nation theory." Even sympathetic historians such as Bipan Chandra saw him as too accommodating to colonial authority. Others labelled him an elitist reformer who worked only for the upper classes, not for the masses. To view Sir Syed's loyalty to the British as servility is to ignore the world he lived in. The rebellion had destroyed Muslim social capital; thousands had been executed, lands confiscated, and jobs lost. His cooperation with the British was not ideological but strategic – an act of survival. He believed political confrontation without education was

His recommendation for Muslims to engage in knowledge before entering the political arena, did not reflect retreat, but preparation... His idea was simple: "Read first, then rule.' He intended that Muslims would adapt to the new system, rather than succumb to it. Syed was far from a communal thinker, as he was concerned with Muslim identity that was cultural, as opposed to separatist. His vision for India was "a beautiful bride, one eye Hindu, the other Muslim. Loss of either reflects a loss of vision." The later communal politics of the 20th century cannot be blamed on him; they were distortions of a message that was about coexistence. Syed was also working within a 19th century bigger movement of Islamic modernism, with people like Jamal al-Din al-Afghani and Muhammad Abduh, but his was specifically Indian, pluralist, dialogic, and reformist approach.

He maintained that genuine faith can never be in conflict with reason because both arise from the same source of divine revelation. In this, he resurrected the rationalist perspective of early Islamic thinkers like Ibn Sina and Al-Farabi, who viewed knowledge as a form of worship. His reinterpretation of texts was less a matter of contrariness than of regeneration and essentially implied a restatement of eternal truths in a newly emerging situation. In an age where religion and science frequently contradict feels eerily relevant. He perceived the divine as not inhibiting reason, but inspiring it. Today, the Sir Syed legacy pertains to more than just the red-brick structures of Aligarh. His life offers a moral lesson on modernising while maintaining your legitimacy and engaging with the state while preserving your dignity. His assertion that advancement must begin in the classroom is a cautionary note to contemporary India where educational indifference and the political framing of education are threats to excellence and equity.

His articulation of education, rational yet ethical, modern yet moral still feels like a lost ideal.

Sir Syed's idea of cultural confidence, not separatism is especially important in this age, when identity politics often deepens into hostilities. He believed that Muslims could be loyal to both Islam and India and did not see the two values as contradictory. His belief in reasoned discussion rather than confrontational means is a lesson for India's increasingly polarised society. He may have shaken off Congress in his lifetime, but his intellectual descendants, both nationalists and reformers, fought for India's liberation. As historian Francis Robinson observed, the Aligarh Movement it created indirectly the educated Muslim middle class that would form the groundswell for India's national awakening even among those who disagreed with his cautious politics. Sir Syed Ahmad Khan was not without flaws, no reformer is, and he sometimes could be conservative in temperament, cautious in politics, and limited by class bias. However, above all else, he was a man who had thought ahead of his time.

He did not preach revolution, but transformation. He did not reject faith, but reinterpreted it. And he did not seek separation, but survival through understanding. In an age of noise and certainty, his voice of measured reason sounds almost prophetic. He once wrote, "When the Quran invites man to think, it is not commanding disbelief it is commanding understanding." That single sentence sums up his life's philosophy: that belief without thought is stagnation, and thought without belief is

More than a century later, as India wrestles with questions of identity, education, and harmony, Sir Syed's message still whispers across time: progress begins in the mind, but it must never end at the cost of the soul.

# CM Omar Under Fire For Comparing Prepaid Electricity Meters To Mobile Recharges

SRINAGAR: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah faced backlash for comparing prepaid electricity meters to mobile recharges, with critics accusing him of making a U-turn

on his pre-election promise. The installation of smart meters has been one of the most debated issues in Kash-

mir, with residents opposing them for being more expensive than previous meters.

Over the past few years, hundreds of protests have been held across the region against the rollout. During the election campaign, Abdullah criticised the meters and told voters that he would address the issue after winning office.

Before the assembly elections, he had told voters that smart meters were being installed even though electricity supply was not yet available, and people would be required to pay bills in advance. He promised that the issue would be addressed

after the elections. After assuming office, Omar described prepaid electricity meters as similar to prepaid mobile phones. He said consumers pay first and then use electricity, questioning why people were concerned and pointing out that the meters were installed across the region, not just in Jammu.

The shift in stance has drawn criticism from political leaders and social media users.

People's Conference (PC) president Sajad Gani Lone said Abdullah's earlier assurances about electricity units were misleading and accused him of reversing his position.

Sajad Gani Lone said, "Now this is no longer about free 200 units of electricity. This is about CM sahib lying through his teeth. The comparison between the pre- and post-election videos of CM sahib about smart meters unambiguously and digitally nails the lies and deception. Mark my words, this is the 'coffee and toffee' moment for CM sahib for all times to come.

Senior Congress leader Vikar Rasool said the preelection promises now appeared inconsistent with his current remarks. "Omar Abdullah spoke about installing smart meters before the elections, but where did that honesty go after he became Chief Minister?'

Meanwhile, social media users also criticised the Chief Minister. Many highlighted clips from his campaign statements alongside his recent comments, accusing him of a U-turn—(KNO)

## Act Responsibly, Don't Repeat Past Mistakes: CS Tells People After MHA Probe

LEH: Soon after the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) ordered a judicial probe into September 24 Leh violence, which left 4 people dead and several injured, Chief Secretary of Ladakh Dr. Pawan Kotwal on Friday urged the people to 'act responsibly' and avoid repeating the past

Addressing a news conference here Dr Kotwal, said, "We have come out of a painful experience. Let us not repeat it. The Government of India has responded positively to every major demand, including the judicial inquiry. Now it is time for peace, progress, and unity. Ladakh's future depends on our collective responsibility."

Dr Kotwal expressed deep sorrow over the tragedy, recalling his visit to the hospital where doctors performed 11 complex surgeries overnight, saving multiple lives. "Their competence, dedication, and the blessings of God saved many people," he said. "Only five patients remain hospitalized, mostly with bone injuries, and are expected to recover within two weeks."

Dr Kotwal said that the Government of India has responded to public demand for transparency by ordering judicial inquiry to be conducted by former Supreme Court Judge Justice B S Chauhan, who will be assisted by an IAS officer and a senior judicial officer. "The order has been issued, and the Commission will begin its work immediately. Its purpose is to uncover the truth and ensure that such an incident never happens

again," the Chief Secretary said. Dr Kotwal said that most people who were detained after the Leh violence have been released. "Only 23 individuals remain in judicial custody under the authority of the courts. The law will take its course and public order must be maintained

at all costs," he added. Dr Kotwal thanked community leaders for their cooperation in restoring peace and normalcy, highlighting that internet services, schools, markets, and tourism activities have now resumed. "We have just withdrawn restrictions under Section 163. Our goal is to keep Ladakh peaceful and stable," he

Dr. Kotwal said, "We cannot afford another incident. Once large crowds form, emotions rise and control becomes difficult. I request everyone not to gather in large numbers. Let's focus on rebuilding our peace and progress."

He commended the patriotism and peace-loving nature of Ladakh's people, noting their historic contribution to national security through the Ladakh Scouts regiment. "Ladakhis are known for their nationalism and devotion to the country. No one can ever doubt their patriotism," he added.

The Chief Secretary said that the High-Powered Committee (HPC) meeting regarding Ladakh's constitutional safeguards will be held shortly. "The Government of India has accepted the demand for a judicial inquiry. The next step is to hold the HPC meeting where all issues and demands will be discussed and resolved

Dr Kotwal said the administration is considering compensation for the families who lost their breadwinners in the incident. "If an innocent person has suffered, the government is positive about providing compensation as per law. The issue is not money, but principle," he said.

Security Measures Dr Kotwal explained that the Rapid Action Force (RAF) has been deployed in replacement of existing forces not as an addition. "The RAF is better trained for mob control and reduces the risk of casualties. We now have two normal and two RAF companies deployed," he said.

He stated that the Government of India is moving ahead with plans to create five new districts in Ladakh, as announced in August . The proposal is currently under consideration by the Ministry of Finance for approval

of necessary posts and resources. On the issue of internet suspension, Dr. Kotwal acknowledged the difficulties faced by students and businesses. "Students depend on online classes and YouTube courses. Traders

and professionals also rely on connectivity. That's why we restored internet services as soon as the situation improved, he explained.

Dr Kotwal said that applications for district-level job recruitment have been invited and that LSSB exams are scheduled for November. "Our focus now is on education, employment, and tourism revival," he said.

The Chief Secretary announced that Ladakh will participate in the WTM London Exhibition an important global tourism event, to promote the region and attract visitors. "We are trying to revive tourism which was affected by recent events. Peace and stability are essential for Ladakh's economy," he said..

He reiterated that traditional village headmen (Goba)play a crucial role in maintaining communication between communities and the administration. "They are respected figures and are appointed by the District Commissioner. Their cooperation is vital for maintaining public order and community welfare," he said—(KNO)

**NEW DELHI:** Germany's Ambassador to India. Philipp Ackermann on Friday hoped that the proposed next meeting between US President Donald Trump and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin will be "more fruitful" than the last one held in Alaska. Speaking at the NDTV World Summit, the diplomat stated that Germany looks at the situation in Ukraine with great concern and feels the desire to see an end to the conflict between Moscow and Kyiv.

"I think we in Germany, and I think that's valid for across Europe, look with great concern and preoccupation of what happens in Ukraine. You know. you talk about fatigue and exhaustion. I think we had a wake-up call, two-three weeks ago when all of a sudden Russian fighter jets entered NATO territory for 15 minutes or something. Then we had drones over Scandinavian airports, all of a sudden, it's not clear whether they were Russian, but the likelihood is there. So. I think Europe more and more feels under threat," said Ackermann.

"So, I think we don't feel the exhaustion or fatigue. We feel the desire and the urge to end this war. And you mentioned a possible meeting between Presi-

"I am from Northern Ireland and for me it is very personal. The ceasefire is the beginning of the process, it is not the end. There are many years of work to go and many challenges ahead, but you must start because violence is not a way to resolve this. There is a complex journey. There are tough decisions. There are huge implementation challenges," Cameron said at the NDTV World Summit.

Having worked in the Middle East for long, the High Commissioner highlighted the significance of sustaining the ceasefire.

"I have worked in the Middle East for long. It is very hard to predict how it will go... I am just hopeful that we see peace. The profound sense of relief that everybody felt when the hostages returned this week, that profound sense of hope and optimism is something we must hold on to. The challenge will be in implementation," she mentioned.

Cameron also described British Prime Minister Keir Starmer's recent visit to India as "fantastic" while recalling the warm welcome extended to the leader and the accompanying delegation in Mumbai. She said that UK sees its ties with India as "future facing partnership" and

# Want Rohit and Virat to play 2027 ODI WC, but will have to perform continuously, says Mishra

NEW DELHI: Former India leg-spinner Amit Mishra said he wishes to see batting stalwarts Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli feature in the 2027 ODI World Cup, but emphasised that consistent performance and fitness will be key to their selection for the mega event.

The upcoming series against Australia, starting in Perth on Sunday, marks the return of the veteran batting stalwarts to international cricket after more than seven months. Both last featured internationally in India's triumph in the 2025 Champions Trophy in March.

"I see India winning this series over Australia. I am a 100 percent Indian team supporter, and I want India to win the series. The performances have been going great. Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli's experience is also there, and I think this is a positive thing for the Indian team.

"They are seniors, but I want them to perform well for the Indian team for as long as possible. I want them to be in the World Cup as well. When there is pressure in the World Cup,

players," Mishra told IANS on the sidelines of Media Mantra's MM Dialogues 2.0 in Gurugram on Friday.

He further spoke about how the longevity of Rohit and Virat in ODIs will depend on fitness and consistent performances. "I said this before that I want to see them play there. But for that, they will have to perform continuously. Everyone knows how important fitness is for the Indian team. They will have to be fit and perform well. But it is good for them as well. If they go and play matches after this series or play domestic matches, it is good for them as well as for the Indian team."

"Being in the World Cup depends on their performance. Of course, it does - these people have made the rule that whoever performs will be on the team. There is no doubt that you are a senior, but performance matters a lot these days. It depends on how match-fit you are. I want them to go and play."

'The most important thing is that you keep talking to them. It is important for everyone, as you can see the same



result when you talk to them. The more you talk to them, the clearer their mind will be. They will know what their responsibilities are and what they have to do," elaborated Mishra

Asked about the challenges of playing just one format, Mishra felt the clarity of being in one format could help both players focus better. "I think they will focus better, as they

know that they have to play in the same format. They know how to play, and moreover, the pressure is less. They are not playing in two formats. They have to play in one format and

'They know where they have to bat and which bowler they have to play against. They have the experience, but they have to be match fit. As I said earlier, you have to be at a certain level to play for an Indian team."

"All of them are doing it. But the most important thing for them, whether they perform or not, is to be match fit and play in the domestic circuit. It's good for them, I've said it before, and I'm saying it again, it's good for the team too.

Mishra added that the presence of senior players like Rohit and Kohli will be crucial for Shubman Gill's growth as captain in ODIs. "Gill has handled everything very well in his captaincy stint so far. He is leading from the front and has shown that. The best thing is that he is enjoying it. He is communicating with all the players. Since he has been a captain, he is performing well.'

"As a youngster, there is no pressure on him to be a captain. and he is performing well for the Indian team. I hope that, as the captain, along with the senior players, you perform well for the Indian team. When

the team to have their (Rohit and Virat) experiences. It's good for the team, and for them too, because the youngsters will be on the right track. Plus, it will be a good thing for Shubman too in being the captain."

"Both of them are players who are always ready to help. It's not like they'll show their ego, or they'll say that they don't want to play, and would try to put them down. It's always been a positive support for both of them, and I think it will be very beneficial for Shubman Gill."

So I think it will be very beneficial for the team, but I would also like them to perform well together because it will be very good for the Indian team if they both perform," he

Real Kashmir, popularly known as the Snow Leopards, were drawn in Group A, dubbed the "Group of Death", alongside Mohun Bagan Super Giant, East Bengal FC, and Chennaiyin FC. The team had been slated to face East Bengal in the tournament opener on October 25, followed by fixtures against Mohun Bagan SG on October 28 and Chennaiyin FC on October 31.

However, logistical challenges in securing travel documents for their overseas players forced the I-League outfit to withdraw

As per the Supreme Court order on September 2, AIFF has to take necessary measures to ensure the Indian football calendar begins on time, which would need the football governing body to find a new commercial partner, after failing to reach a new Masters Right Agreement with the AIFF.

#### Labuschagne replaces Green in **Australia's squad for India ODIs**

PERTH: Australia allrounder Cameron Green has been ruled out of the upcoming ODI series against India due to side soreness, with Marnus Labuschagne named as his replacement. The injury has been assessed as low grade and Cricket Australia (CA) has opted for a precautionary approach given Green's significance to their Ashes plans.

Green will miss the three ODIs scheduled for October 19, 23 and 25, but is expected to return for Western Australia's next Sheffield Shield fixture starting October 28. The all-rounder made his bowling comeback in last week's Shield match - his first since undergoing back surgery last year - where he picked up a wicket in a four-over spell. CA confirmed that his current setback is unrelated to the operation he had last

Labuschagne returns to the ODI setup in the midst of a rich form, as two of his four centuries for his domestic side, Queensland, have come in the 50-over format. The top-order batter was initially overlooked for selection after he returned scores of 1 and 1 in the home ODIs against South Africa in August.
